

CGHA Goalie procedures

- 1) Each team will have one coach designated as responsible for goalie training. This person does not need to be a bench coach but should attend all practices when possible.
- 2) The team goalie(s) and goalie coach should attend all Sunday goalie clinics. Goalie clinics should take priority over team practices. Attending both is fine but the clinic is the priority. Head coaches need to stress to the goalies that clinics are not optional and should be treated as a scheduled practice. Games are first priority but whenever possible they should attend clinic if the game was earlier in the day.
- 3) The team goalie coach will learn drills, and goalie info at the clinics to take back to your practices
- 4) The goalie coach will help as shooters and trainers.
